Over 25 volunteers showed up on April 29th at 9:00 am to commit over 150 hours of volunteer labor to painting, landscaping, and clearing debris at the Wellsburg First Ward City Park. The idea originated with two young ladies involved with the city park committee.

As the city Grant Writer, I indicated this endeavor is very impressive and when calculated using the national average for volunteer labor, the volunteers generated approximately \$4,500.00 in matching money to use with a park grant.

The city is financially strapped and the grants often require matching funds and this volunteer effort can be used as in-kind labor.



Brooke County students also showed up along with other interested citizens from the community. The City of Wellsburg Street Superintendent Mark Tingler also showed up on his day off to lend a hand with the utilities and other park maintenance projects.



All-in-all this was a very good day and bodes well with so many city officials contributing their time volunteering with other dedicated residents of Brooke County.


