
Central Park became a focal point when

City of Wellsburg

\$70,000 Grant

The URA reported that it has successfully secured \$70,000 through the Opportunity Appalachia grant for predevelopment work on the Bell Buildings. The renovation of these properties is estimated to generate \$3.9 million in sales, support 23 jobs directly, and generate \$1.3 million in labor income. Small business and rental activity will provide ongoing economic benefits to the region. Total impacts from the retail, restaurant and rental activities are estimated to generate \$898,000 in local sales and support 13 jobs and \$369,500 in labor income.

The grant will enable the URA to engage a firm to guide us on several issues. The result will be a report on how best to restore and configure each building keeping the historic nature intact, analyze long-term effects and benefits to the community, recommend an approach to market each structure, and offer suggestions on how best to fund the construction and marketing.

\$15,000 Grant

The URA reported that it has successfully secured \$15,000 in AARP grant funding, which will be used for repair and beautification the of Wellsburg's Historic Town Square, an underutilized public space in our community. This space is a pedestrian city block with brick pavers, and the main access point for various buildings, including City Hall. Proposed improvements include the restoration and leveling of existing brick pavers on Town Square; the addition of tables, umbrellas. chairs, and trash receptacles; the enhancement of accessibility with artistic crosswalks; and additional beautification through murals painted in the windows of the adjacent vacant buildings.


I've learned my lesson. I will not promise pictures until the job is done.
